
Choosing Action Plan Goals





Resource Mapping

Mapping Resources to Support Tobacco-Free Districts

Tobacco use can directly impact student success. Districts play a vital role in ensuring that all students have equitable access to resources that prevent them from using tobacco products and support students who need help quitting. Providing a map of available resources increases the chance that students access what they need to improve overall student success by preventing or reducing tobacco use.





LEADERSHIP TEAM

The goal of this key activity is to **establish a team**. A team will be useful in helping you put the policy in place by completing the actions in the checklist. Use the following checklist to ensure a team is in place.

MODEL POLICY LANGUAGE

Appoint a team to implement Tobacco-Free District Policy.

ACTION STEPS

- Name person responsible for leading team to implement the policy.
- Establish a team that includes people serving in all the <u>roles listed in the</u> policy (see page 12).
- Schedule team meetings during times all members can attend and send invitations.
- During the first meeting, share the team's purpose and establish team roles, expectations, and agreements.
- During subsequent meetings, ensure each section of the policy is discussed. Consider:
 - · When and how it will be put in place?
 - Who is responsible?
 - What resources and training are needed?
 - · What programs and services are needed?
 - · How will the team assess the policy?
 - What needs to be communicated to the school community and how?
- Develop action plans that are feasible to implement within the district calendar.
- Ensure all team members can access meeting agendas and notes.

Resource Highlight



School communities are at the forefront of providing resources and support far beyond academics. Any time we connect a student or family to potential support, we have made a referral. A **referral pathway**¹ is a way of documenting and communicating the steps that are taken after identifying a need for support. This helps everyone understand how to get the support they need when they need it.

Use this resource to implement a clearly defined referral pathway that connects people to resources in a timely, consistent, and equitable way.
